Student Application Process Review

- All applications received are dated.
- All applications received will be reviewed on a rolling basis.
- The school will schedule a time for a placement assessment for the student.
- Parents will be informed of our admission decision.
- Parents may appeal the school's acceptance decision if they can give compelling reasons why their child should be accepted.

Criteria for Acceptance

- Parents agree to terms of enrollment.
- Parents agree to attend Parent Meetings and Parent Teacher Conferences.
- Student is working on an instructional level no more than two grade levels below his/her age appropriate grade level, as indicated by informal assessments.
- Student does not have prohibitive behavioral problems, such as tendency toward aggression or violence (as shown by references and school records).
- Student shows interest in being at Charlotte Mason Community School.
- Student does not have a prohibitive disability, that is, one for which we are not equipped to teach.
- Space is available for pertinent grade level.
- Children entering kindergarten must be five years of age on or before August 31, 2022.

Parental Commitments

- Ensure that student is in school every day with the necessary books, materials, and supplies, except in case of illness or emergency
- Make sure that student arrives at school with ample time to organize books and supplies, and to be seated in class by 8:00 A.M.
- Attend all parent teacher conferences
- Attend regularly scheduled parent meetings
- Facilitate communication with the school by committing to meet with teachers / principal as needed and respond to emails / phone calls
- Work with school staff to promote appropriate speech, behavior, and social development in student
- Pick up student promptly at the end of school day
- Provide student with a quiet, distraction-free environment for homework and studies
- Ensure that tuition payments are current
- Contribute to the operation of the school through volunteering
- Support the school's efforts to help students resolve conflict peacefully, with the goal of restoring relationships and repairing harm



2023 - 2024 CMCS Tuition

As a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization seeking to meet the educational needs of Detroit children, the goal of the Charlotte Mason Association of Detroit (CMAD) is to offer every child a quality education, in a safe and nurturing environment, regardless of his or her financial circumstances. Charlotte Mason Community School (CMCS), governed by CMAD, has set tuition below the actual cost of operation in order to make the school accessible to families.

Non-Detroit Resident Tuition: \$9,875

Detroit Resident Tuition: \$6,875

Tuition discounts are available to families enrolling multiple children that do not otherwise qualify for tuition assistance: 15% discount for the 2nd child, 20% discount for the 3rd child, 25% for the 4th child, etc.

Tuition Assistance:

We value socio-economic diversity in our school community, so in order to make CMCS accessible to families at every income level, we offer tuition assistance.

Tuition assistance is based on need and is available to:

• Residents of Detroit, Hamtramck, and Highland Park

Special Note:

The actual cost of educating a child at CMCS is \$10,439. Tuition is intentionally set lower than this because we desire for every child to have access to this beautiful education. Additionally, tuition assistance is available for those who require it. Each of these decisions represents a significant financial sacrifice on the part of the school, but we consider it a sacrifice worth making.

Similarly, each family is expected to prioritize the expense of their child's education in their budget. We realize that it may require a sacrifice in some areas, and we believe it is a sacrifice worth making. As a community school, it is vitally important for all of us – the board of directors, staff, volunteers, families, and students – to work together to make the CMCS mission a reality.

Our school has been sustained through the sacrifice, hard work, and faith of many throughout the past 22 years, and we look forward to carrying out its mission for many years to come... together. Thus, tuition assistance will be calculated in such a way as to ask each family to contribute sacrificially and equitably to the sustainability of the school.



Kindergarten Readiness

Dear Parent,

We are pleased that you are considering the CMCS kindergarten. CMCS strives to offer children the best school experience possible. Part of a child having a good school experience is readiness. Below is a guide to help you determine your child's readiness for kindergarten. Mastery of all the activities is not necessary, but your child should be able to perform the majority of activities in each category before beginning kindergarten. If your child cannot perform the majority of these actions, you may want to work with him/her over the summer to build confidence in the areas he/she has not yet mastered.

Self Help Skills

- Can use the bathroom independently and complete accompanying hygiene tasks –Required.
- Able to dress self (puts on coat, fastens snaps, buttons and zippers)
- States full name and age

Social/Emotional Skills

- Separates from caregivers without excessive upset
- Plays/shares with other children
- Waits his turn
- Attends to an adult-directed task for at least 5 minutes
- Recognizes and responds to other people's feelings
- Uses "please" and "thank you"

Language Skills (Expressive and Receptive)

- Expresses needs and wants verbally
- Speaks in complete sentences (5 to 6 words)
- Is generally understood by adults
- Uses words, not physical action, to express emotions such as anger or disappointment
- Understands and follows two-step directions
- Understands positional vocabulary (i.e. on top of, below, next to)

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Fine Motor Skills

- Holds pencil/crayon in a non-fisted grip
- Able to control scissors to complete an intentional task
- Traces lines and basic shapes
- Copies basic figures such as a circle, square and a straight line
- Draws people with a head, body, 2 arms, and 2 legs

Gross Motor Skills

- Runs and skips
- Jumps with feet together and hops while balancing on one foot.
- Climbs stairs with alternating feet
- Walks backwards
- Bounces a kickball
- Attempts a two-handed catch of a kickball

Math Skills

- Counts from 1 to 10
- Recognizes/points to/identifies basic shapes (square, circle, triangle, rectangle)
- Beginning to count with one-to-one correspondence
- Can sort items by one or more attributes
- Identifies, either verbally or by pointing to, the colors of crayons in the 8-count box (black, blue, brown, green, orange, red, purple, yellow)

Literacy/Phonemic Awareness Skills

- Enjoys being read to / listening to stories
- Recognizes environmental print (familiar logos, signs and words)
- Knows how to handle a book (i.e. holds book right side up, knows where it starts and ends)
- Identifies some letter sounds, either by sound to letter or letter to sound
- Recognizes own name in print
- Able to discern whether or not two words rhyme, may be able to provide a third rhyme for the words
- Tries to write own name or other ideas by using symbols or letters
- Can draw a picture to express an idea
